Principal's Renovation Update

Findley is scheduled for a complete renovation along with a new addition on the south side of the building. The completion date is scheduled for the beginning of the 2013-2014 school year. The new addition's construction will begin this school year starting March 15. This construction will not affect the main part of the building and classes will continue as normal without any disruptions.

As we continue to have snow days our end of the year will also continue to change. The District is currently saying our **last three student days will be a 12:20 dismissal** giving staff time to pack and prepare for the renovation. Everything in the entire building will be moved out allowing for construction on the main part to start immediately after the last day of school.

Findley staff will still be looking at opportunities to provide some Additional Learning Opportunities for the summer even with the renovation occurring. More information will come out about this as the summer approaches. Findley's office staff will be relocated to Harding Middle School only for the summer. Findley's number will still be the same during the summer hours and we'll continue to make sure we're available for any questions or needs you may have throughout the entire summer. I'll continue to send updates, but please know the end result for our students of a newly renovated building will be well worth the few hassles we encounter. Fifth graders will see a performance of the Des Moines Symphony on February 26th


Each class will tour the Des Moines Art Center February 26th, 27th, or 28th.
